PONDER THIS

*Receiving Holy Communion
(Part Two)*

Our Lord is truly present in the Holy Eucharist! The manner in which we receive Holy Communion should be a sign of our belief. It should be as reverent as possible to please God.

For most of us, we received our First Communion many years ago and the rite has changed over the years. We used to receive under one form, we knelt at an altar rail, and received on the tongue. Today we receive under two forms, stand, and receive in our hands or on our tongues. Each style has a very specific way we are to act. At communion time, we are to rise from our pews and enter the center aisle. We process to the priest/Extra-Ordinary Minister of Holy Communion (EOMHC), with our hands folded in prayer position. Stopping in front of the priest but back far enough to avoid hitting the communion bowl, we bow reverently, then step forward. If receiving in the hand, place your dominate hand on the bottom and place your other hand on top making a "bowl" to receive the host. Immediately place the host in your mouth with your dominate hand. Step aside and proceed to the chalice. If receiving on the tongue, after you bow, step forward, open your mouth, protrude your tongue so the host may be placed on your tongue. Immediately retract your tongue and close your mouth and proceed to the chalice. At the chalice, bow, take the chalice from the EOMHC, take a sip, and return the chalice to the EOMHC. If not receiving from the chalice, you must still bow before passing the chalice. Our Lord is present in the Chalice!
